VAC45 Preconditioning Protocols

A "typical" VAC45 program includes

- Vaccination protocol
- Castrated and healed
- Polled genetics or dehorned and healed
- Parasite control
- Minimum 45 day weaning period
- Bunk training

Veterinary-Client-Patient-Relationship:Oklahoma Practice Act Definition

- a. the licensed veterinarian has assumed the responsibility for making medical judgments regarding the health of an animal or animals and the need for medical treatment, and the client, owner or other caretaker has agreed to follow the instructions of the licensed veterinarian; and
- b. there is sufficient knowledge of the animal or animals by the licensed veterinarian to initiate at least a general or preliminary diagnosis of the medical condition of the animal or animals in that:
 - 1. the licensed veterinarian has recently seen or is personally acquainted with the keeping and care of the animal or animals, or
 - 2. the licensed veterinarian has made medically necessary and timely visits to the premises where the animal or animals are kept or both, and
- c. the licensed veterinarian is readily available for follow-up in case of adverse reactions or failure of the regimen of therapy, or has arranged for emergency medical coverage, and
- d. the licensed veterinarian's actions would conform to applicable federal law and regulations.

 - Respiratory Viruses
 - **I**BR
 - PI3
 - BVDV I&II
 - BRSV
 - Clostridial
 - 7 way/8 way/9 way
 - Tetanus
 - Pasteurella
 - M. haemolytica
 - P. multocida

- Effective Protection
- Killed vs. Modified Live
- Expiration Dates
- Temperature Maintenance
- UV Light

Refrigerated Vaccines







Handling Vaccines







Purchase as close to processing time as possible

Buy from reputable sources

Read vaccine labels

Use a refrigerator thermometer



Use reconstituted vaccines within the hour

Use caution when cleaning reusable syringes

Disease Treatment SOPs



- Discuss in advance
- Develop plan
- Annual review with veterinarian
- Training
- Accessible medications for common illness
 - Respiratory
 - Bloat
 - Lameness

Disease Treatment SOPs Respiratory Disease

- Assessing illness
- Diagnostics
- Antibiotics administration
- Anti-inflammatory administration
- Retreating
- Necropsy







Costs

- Respiratory Vaccine ~ \$2-\$3
- Clostridial Vaccine ~ \$1-\$2
- Deworming ~ \$1
- External Parasite Pour On ~ \$1
- Fly Tag ~ \$1
- Implant ~ \$2-\$3
- Castration ~ \$5
- Dehorning ~ \$5-\$10
- Other Variables
 - Processing location/Chute fees/Trip charges
 - Group size/calf weight
 - Facility quality
 - Personnel costs

Weaned, Vaccinated, and Dehorned	\$10.98	0.67
