Following are details which may be helpful to consider in

"Barn Quilt Evaluation"

Basics:

- 1. **Contest guidelines: were they followed?** (Contest sponsors or event coordinator should be able to assist with answering this.)
- 2. Does the base structure's surface appear to be well prepared?
- 3. Is the surface smooth?
- 4. Does base appear to have been primed?
- 5. Is there primer or paint protecting the back side?
- 6. Are the thin sides of the barn quilt also painted?
- 7. Do the colors on the thin sides wrap around from the color on the front of the barn quilt?
- **8. Was exterior paint used?** (May not be possible to determine)
- 9. Other:

Design:

- 1. Is the pattern eye-catching?
- 2. Are the colors well chosen? Are they complimentary?
- 3. Does the design fill the board? Are there enough sections or units to make the design appear complete / finished?
- 4. Is painting technique well done—are lines clean & accurate? Do all or most of the sections (also called "units") meet precisely at intersecting points?
- 5. Are there no or very few "bleeds"?
- **6. Is the pattern interesting, complex or two-dimensional?** If well executed, this may be worth extra merit!
- 7. Is the pattern "an original" or perhaps "custom, based on an actual quilt"? (May not be possible to determine; if "Yes" this may be worth extra merit!)
- 8. Other:
